The Area Road Foremen are management, salaried and exempt from overtime. Area Road Foremen will not be paid overtime for work over 40 hours in a week; work in excess of 40 hours per week may be required at times to ensure appropriate performance of essential job functions. Holidays, personal leave, vacation, and sick leave will be the same as outlined in the Monona County Handbook. Area Road Foremen are expected to give 4 weeks minimum notice before resignation or retirement.

The Office Manager, and the Assistant to the Engineer are paid hourly and not exempt from overtime. These positions will be paid at time and a half for work over 40 hours in a week, but work over 40 hours per week is not normally anticipated for the Office Manager. Holidays, personal leave, vacation, and sick leave will be the same as outlined in the Monona County Handbook. The employees in these positions are expected to give 4 weeks minimum notice before resignation or retirement.

The engineer's recommendation was that the objecting parcels be annexed into the McNeill Intercounty Drainage District. Furthermore, a boundary correction to align the watershed boundary to the west right-of-way line along N Manley Street from Main Street to Linn Street is also recommended as shown on the map attached with the Field Review Report.
